Special access programs include the University Challenge for Excellence Program, the Engineering IMPACT Program, the Engineering PREP Program, recruited athletes, and students who reported Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) scores.

In addition to the four schools listed, first-time, first-year students enroll in the two-year Dental Hygiene program offered through Dental Medicine and in baccalaureate programs offered through General Studies. In Fall Term, 2001 Dental Medicine enrolled 30, and General Studies enrolled 65, first-time, first-year students.
